



Make a difference and become a volunteer victim advocate.

The Brighton and Commerce City Police Department are seeking highly motivated individuals to become volunteer victim advocates.

Victim Services Unit (VSU) provides support and services to victims of crime or traumatic situations such as domestic violence, traffic fatalities, assaults and sexual assaults. VSU provides crisis intervention 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Each volunteer is required to cover a minimum of four 12-hour shifts per month. Each volunteer receives 40 hours of training before responding to calls on their own.

- UNDERGO AND PASS AN EXTENSIVE BACKGROUND SCREENING
- NO PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE IS REQUIRED
- BILINGUAL NEEDED, NOT REQUIRED
